1	FREE ROAMING: PCAAP currently has funding to spay and neuter <i>free roaming</i> cats in Potter County. All free roaming cats WILL have their left ear tipped as a means to identify the fact that they have been spayed or neutered.
2	ABANDONED/HOMELESS: PCAAP currently has limited funding to assist with the cost of spaying or neutering homeless/abandoned cats that have been adopted/rehomed/taken in. PCAAP highly recommends that ALL cats spayed/neutered under our program have their ear tipped to avoid unnecessary surgeries.

Cats spayed/neutered under these programs will also be administered a rabies shot, distemper shot (if over one year old as determined by the veterinarian's best judgment for TNR, or for any homeless/abandoned cat/kitten,) flea treatment, deworming and checked for ear mites.
